LUMHS Participation in Consultative Workshop on Disaster Preparedness and Climate Change

Event Title: Consultative Workshop – "Bridging the Collaboration Gap between Academia and PDMA/DDMA Sindh through Curriculum Development and Advancing Research on Disaster Preparedness, DRR/Climate Change Education"

Date: 21st October 2024

Organized by: Foundation for Rural Development Program (FRDP) Pakistan in collaboration with DevRes, CESVI, Welt Hunger Hilfe, and the European Union under the project *Building Institutional Capacity and Resilience Against Natural Disasters (BRAND)*.

Report:

Liaquat University of Medical and Health Sciences (LUMHS), Jamshoro, actively participated in the consultative workshop on Disaster Preparedness and Climate Change, organized under the BRAND project. The workshop served as a collaborative platform to strengthen the partnership between academia and disaster management authorities, particularly the Provincial and District Disaster Management Authorities (PDMA/DDMA) Sindh.

The primary focus of the workshop was to explore ways to integrate Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) and Climate Change Education into academic curricula and research initiatives. This integration aims to enhance institutional preparedness, resilience, and community awareness regarding natural disasters and climate-related challenges.

Faculty members and representatives from LUMHS contributed their expertise and insights during the consultation sessions. Their active participation highlighted the university's commitment to promoting sustainable development, public health resilience, and evidence-based disaster management strategies through education and research.

LUMHS's involvement in this consultative initiative aligns with its broader mission of contributing to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly SDG 13 – Climate Action and SDG 11 – Sustainable Cities and Communities, by fostering education and collaboration for a safer and more resilient future.

Introduction

TH SCIENCES. JAWSHORO Under the visionary leadership of the Honorable Vice Chancellor, Prof. Dr. Ikram Din Ujjan, Liaquat University of Medical and Health Sciences (LUMHS) collaborated with the Sindh Mental Health Authority (SMHA) to conduct a community-based research study titled "Knowledge, Attitude, and Practices (KAP) of Thari People about Mental Health."

The study aimed to assess the level of awareness, cultural perceptions, and behavioral practices related to mental health among the people of Tharparkar, with the objective of guiding future policy development, community awareness, and intervention programs in the region.

Research Leadership and Team

- Research Team: Included Dr. Bharat Kumar and Dr. Manisha (Consultant Psychiatrists, Civil Hospital Mithi), Mr. Fayaz Shaikh (Thar Foundation), and a group of trained data collectors who conducted extensive fieldwork in Tharparkar.



Research Dissemination Event

The Research Report and Findings were formally launched at a ceremony held at PMA House, Karachi. The event was attended by a wide range of psychiatrists, doctors, researchers, academicians, media representatives, and members of civil society, reflecting broad sectoral interest in the study's outcomes.

Other notable attendees included Mr. Farhan Ansari (General Manager, Thar Foundation), Brig. Tarique (Rescue 1122), Dr. Aijaz (Deputy Director General Health), Dr. Nisar Sohoo (Medical Superintendent, Sir C.J. Hospital), and senior officials from the Pakistan Medical Association (PMA).

Significance and Impact

This collaborative research reflects LUMHS's continued commitment to:

- Advancing public and community mental health research.
- Promoting awareness and destigmatization of mental health issues in marginalized regions.
- Supporting evidence-based policy formulation through partnerships with government and development organizations.
- Contributing to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 3 Good Health and Well-being) and SDG 17 Partnerships for the Goals.

The findings of this KAP study are expected to serve as an important reference for designing culturally sensitive mental health programs, strengthening service delivery, and informing provincial mental health strategies in Sindh.

Conclusion

Through this collaboration with SMHA and partner institutions, **LUMHS** reaffirmed its leadership in community-oriented public health research and its commitment to improving



mental health and well-being in underserved areas of Pakistan. The initiative stands as a model for academia-policy partnerships aimed at promoting mental health awareness and resilience across communities.











LUMHS Participation and Contribution in Policy Development and Strategies for Flood Management

Event: Flood 2022 Provincial Learning Forum: Insights, Stories, and Recommendations for Future Resilience Building.

Liaquat University of Medical and Health Sciences (LUMHS) participated in this provincial forum as part of its ongoing commitment to contributing academic expertise and research insights to provincial and national resilience and policy development efforts.

Background: Every year, Pakistan faces recurring floods that lead to severe humanitarian, environmental, and economic consequences. These floods cause widespread displacement, damage to infrastructure, loss of livelihoods, and increased health risks, particularly in vulnerable rural communities. The recurring disasters highlight the urgent need for sustainable flood management and resilience-building strategies.

University representatives actively engaged in discussions addressing:

- The health and well-being impact of climate-induced disasters on vulnerable populations.
- The importance of evidence-based policy formulation and community health preparedness in flood-affected regions.
- Integrating public health education and disaster risk management into academic eurricula.
- Collaborative research and data-driven modelling to forecast climate and health risks.

Through this engagement, LUMHS reinforced its institutional objective to support adaptive management, policy innovation, and capacity building through academic participation in national and regional forums.

Establishment of LUMHS Public School for Underprivileged Community

Objective/ Overview:

Background

In Sindh province, where the literacy rate remains the lowest in Pakistan, Liaquat University of Medical and Health Sciences (LUMHS), located in a rural and underprivileged region, has taken a significant step to address this challenge through an educational empowerment initiative. Recognizing the need to promote education as a means to break the cycle of poverty, the university leadership launched a public school within the LUMHS campus dedicated to



providing free quality education to children from marginalized communities. The school offers free education to the children of domestic staff and local underprivileged families and also distributes free books and study materials at the beginning of each academic year to ensure that financial constraints do not hinder learning. This initiative is a collaborative effort of LUMHS students (as SDG Volunteers), faculty members, and the university administration. The students play an active role in the project, not only by motivating street children and other underprivileged groups to enroll in the school but also by volunteering as teaching assistants. Each week, different groups of students conduct classes, contributing their time, knowledge, and compassion to uplift the educational standards of the community and promote the values of equality, inclusion, and lifelong learning.


